- 7. Checking if the First Aid Kit is up-to date and the medicines are within their expiry date. Replenish as per need.

(e) Yearly Maintenance

- 1. Practice of Kitchen garden for Mid-day meal in all the Schools.
- 2. Plantation and flower garden in an around the school campus for beautification.

16. SAFETY MEASURES TO BE TAKEN BY SCHOOL AUTHORITY: -

- i. Teachers should always advise the students to maintain Covid-19 appropriate behavior in the school like regular wearing of masks, hand sanitizers and social distancing while in classes.
- ii. Regular thermal scanning to all students and staff and parents in the school campus.
- iii. Provision of good furniture in the school, electric wiring and water tap to avoid any untoward incident in the schools.
